To be a leading force for good, on behalf of the RWHA, alleviating the suffering of those in poverty, pain or in need of care, whilst also supporting the environment.

The RWHA Charity Fund donates to local charities in which Warrant-holding companies, or their employees are actively involved. Small grants of up to £500 are open to employees of Warrant-holding companies who are fundraising for charity. Medium grants of up to £3,000 are available for Warrant-holding companies or

their team to apply for a specific item, activity or project for a charity in which they are actively involved. Match-funding is encouraged. Large Grants of up to £10,000 are donated towards charity projects, which have a Royal Patronage. From time-to-time special grant schemes are announced.



The National Literacy Trust £5,000 large grant to set up book corners in community cafes and recruit volunteers, supported with £5,000 match funding by Frank Smythson Ltd.

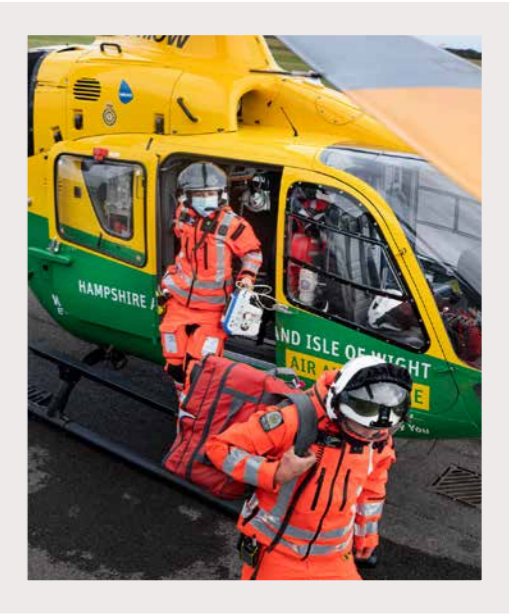
In 2023, 39 charities from a variety of sectors were supported with a total of £106,000, including 4 large grants to LEAF (Linking Environment & Farming), The National Literacy Trust, ABF Soldiers' Charity and The British Red Cross.

Recent medium grants have been to provide a special garden space for a hospice, to fund a three day/two night residential adventure trip for 16 deprived young people and for display equipment, to raise awareness of a charity that helps families in need.

Sponsored Charity: Alma Beacon

The origins of Alma Beacon, the working name of the registered charity Windsor Christian Action, can be traced back to 2009. It followed the tragic death of a local man, Patrick O’Leary, who was found on a bench in Windsor. He had died from cold and neglect.

The charity, which became registered in 2013, now encompass 3 projects, each of which focuses on the vulnerable in our community.

Windsor Homeless Project - WHP provide hot lunches to the homeless and vulnerable community 4 days a week and during the cold weather, hot suppers 3 evenings a week. It also provides emergency clothing, housing and benefits and employment advice, medical sign posting, drug and alcohol abuse counselling, and outreach support etc.

Street Angels patrol the night-time economy in Windsor at weekends, to ensure people in the community and visitors have a safe and pleasant experience. Working closely with the police, ambulance services and licenced premises, they support hundreds of visitors each year, make almost 50 referrals to other agencies and calm over 70 potentially volatile situations.

Windsor FoodShare - WFS supports families who are struggling with relentless rising costs, by providing non-perishable foods, fresh fruit, and vegetables to local households to help alleviate food poverty. In 2023 they provided food for the equivalent of 10,000 people, an increase of almost 30% over the previous year.

In mid 2020, it was decided that the charity needed its own dedicated building to cope with the increased space requirements of the Homeless Project; storage of consumables and uniforms, training, and fund-raising facilities for Street Angels; and a central Windsor storage and distribution unit for FoodShare to supplement the Dedworth main hub.

On December 4th 2023, after two years of unwavering dedication and support, the doors

opened. This milestone achievement, made possible by the generous contributions of very many individuals, companies and other organisations - including significant support from The National Lottery Community Fund - marks an exciting new chapter for the charity.

Located at 73a Alma Road, Windsor SL4 3HD, the Alma Beacon building will serve as a shared space for our three projects. It aims to embody the essence of kindness, nourishment, hope, and guidance. With the establishment of this new facility, the charity is now better equipped to provide integrated support to vulnerable individuals in the community, addressing issues such as food poverty, homelessness, and night-time vulnerability, enabling the charity to make an even greater difference to the lives of the vulnerable in our community.

Thanks to our Partners & Sponsors, the charity has made tremendous progress, but there is still much to do! This year we need to install sound absorbing materials in our new building; we urgently need a laundry facility; and we will need to consider the provision of overnight accommodation during cold weather, because of the increased numbers of rough sleepers.

In 1996 she was made a Brother of The Art Workers' Guild and was honoured to serve the Guild as its Master in 2021. That year she was also awarded Maker of the Year at the Heritage Craft Awards.

Sheppard works on a variety of scale. Her larger architectural pieces may be found in many private and public buildings. These include the National Trust property, Dyrham Park, the Wessex Children's Hospice and Bristol, Portsmouth and Winchester Cathedrals.

Her work has been presented to Queen Elizabeth and Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother. She made several pieces for a suite presented to No 10 Downing Street by the Glass Engraving Trust. Other commissions include works for the BBC, Chelsea Physic Garden, Civil Aviation Authority, The World Meteorological Society and The Royal Horticultural Society.

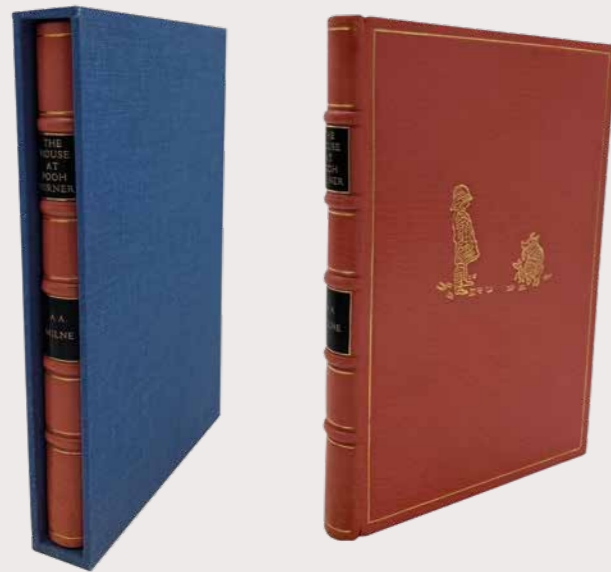

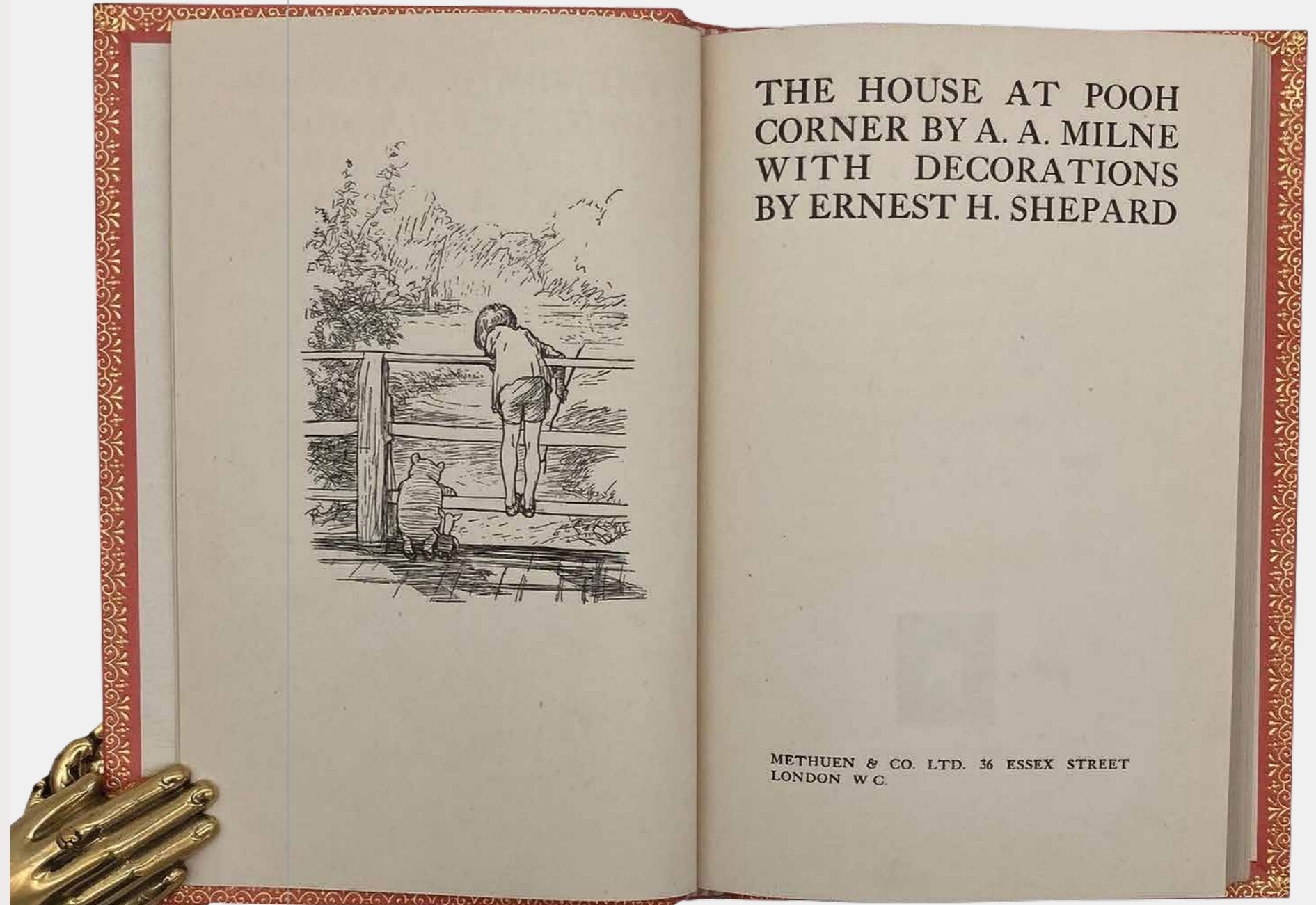

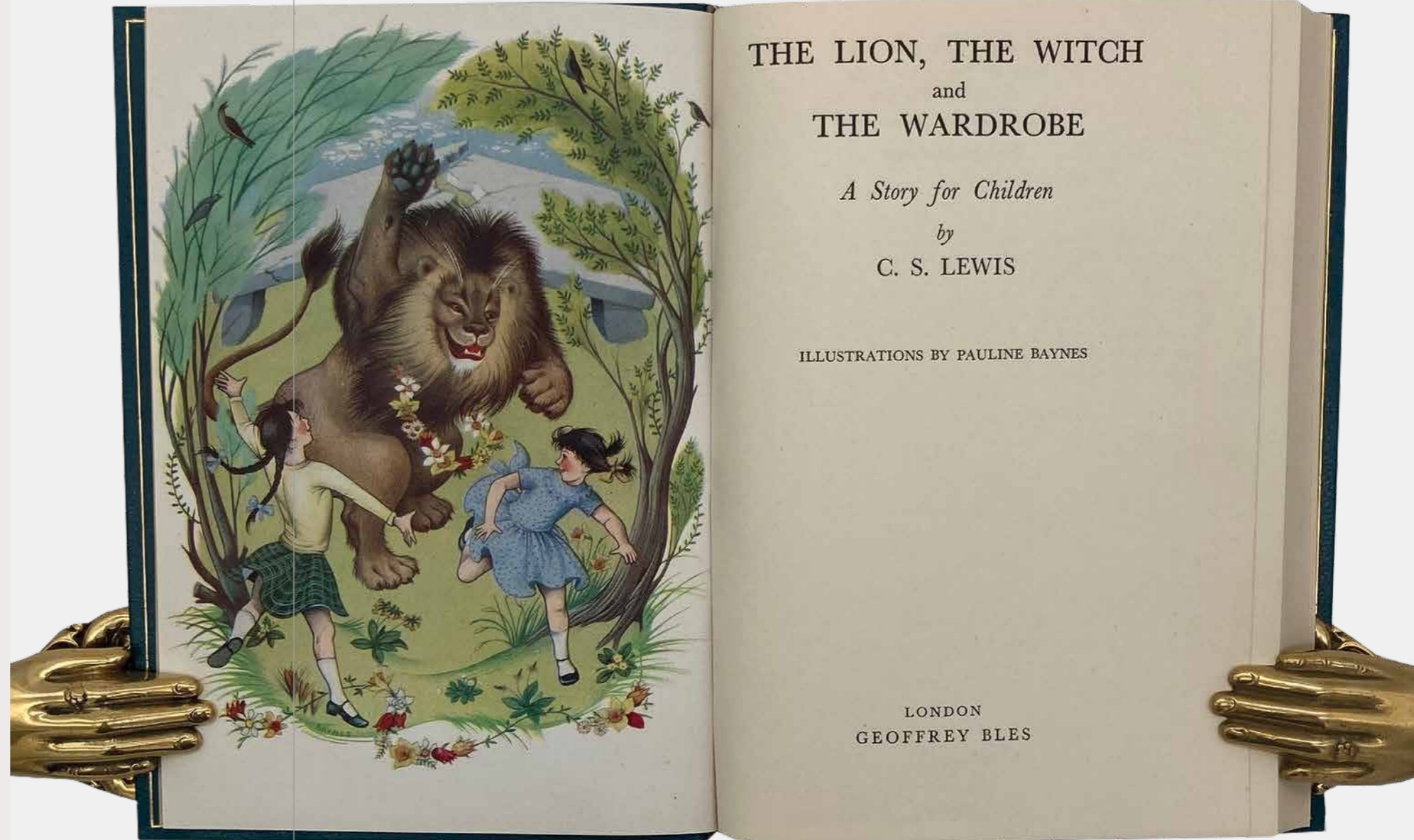

I did not set out to create Jen Jones Welsh Quilts and Blankets. It is something that evolved.

Arriving in Wales from the USA in 1971 I was soon aware that an important aspect of the visual Heritage of Wales was in danger of being lost. The Welsh Quilt, an amazing hand sewn finite commodity, was for the most part considered to be 'old bedding' and excess to requirements. I started, what I now think of as a salvage operation, buying them in auctions for almost nothing. Very often they would be bundled under the auctioneers table only to be kicked out at the end of the sale when most of the participants had left for the day. Writing about them and advertising to buy, I paid well above auction prices.

In 2016 we were awarded a Royal Warrant by HRH the Prince of Wales. This year we felt so honoured to be granted The Royal Warrant by His Majesty King Charles. His Majesty and Her Majesty Queen Camilla both love and respect Welsh textiles which is to me a very special endorsement for a particularly important part of Welsh Cultural History and we are simply delighted that our quilt will help to raise funds for the RWHA charity.

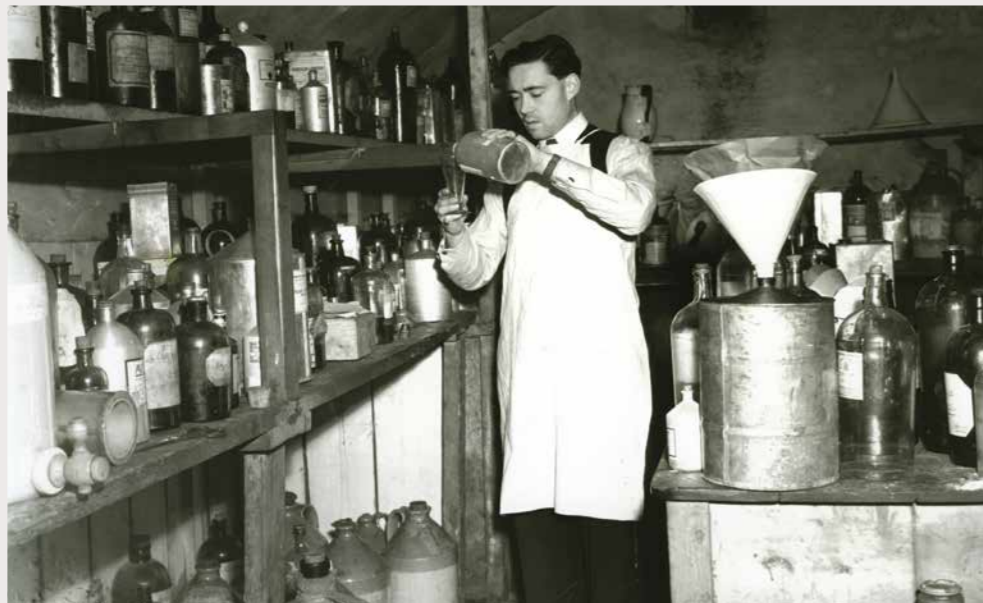

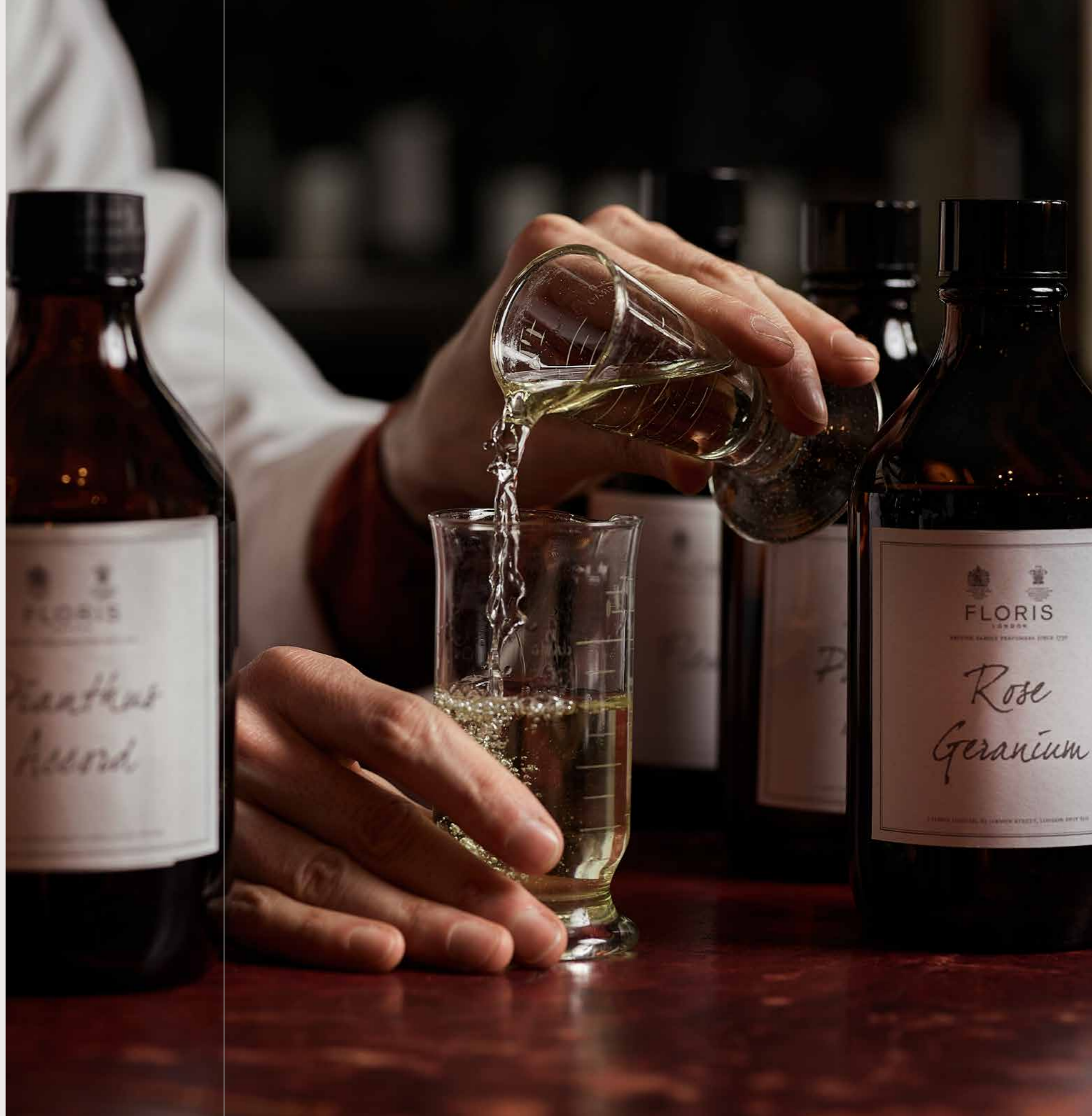

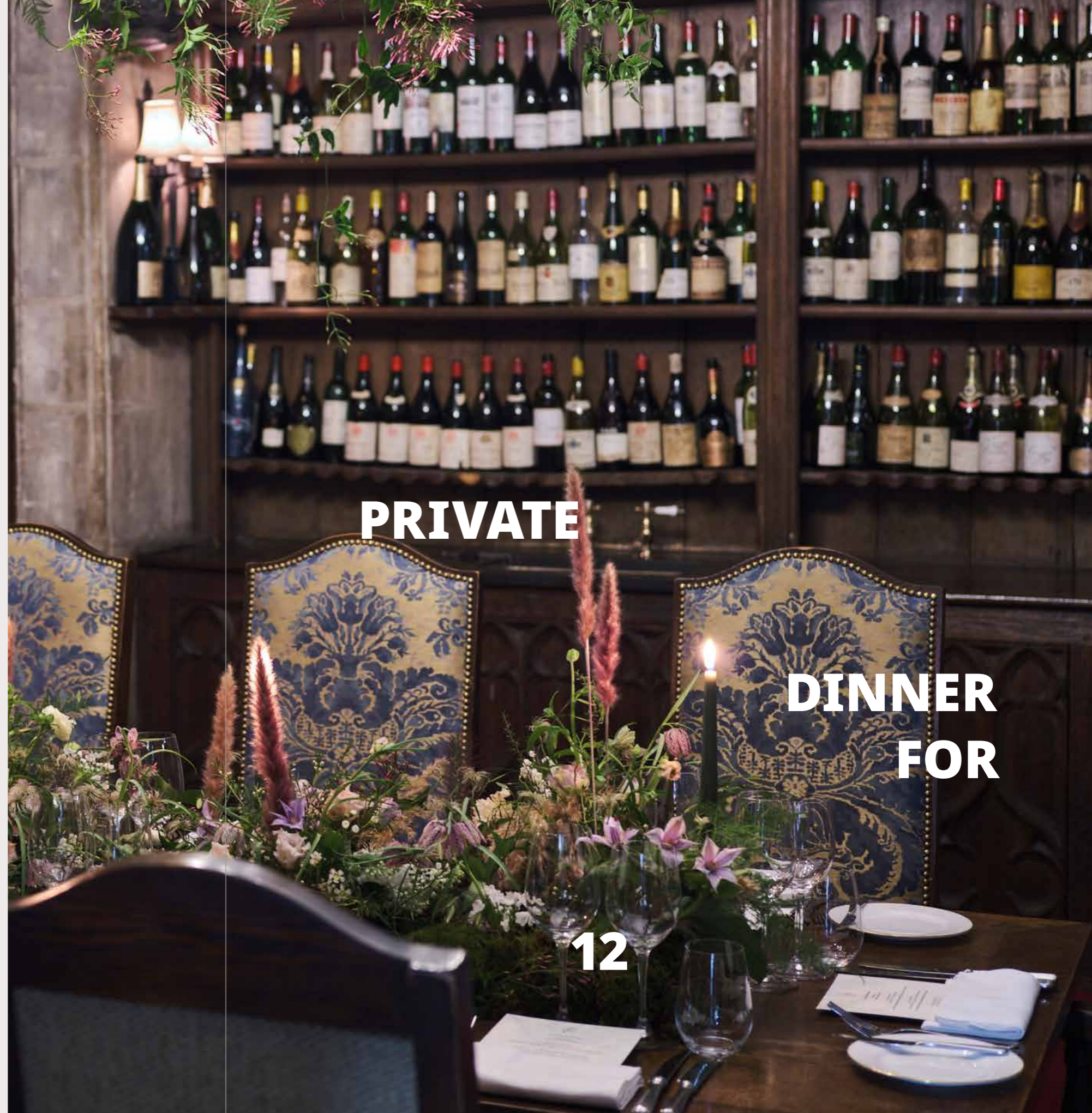

A Luxury Piece of Cartographic Art

THE QUEEN MARY ATLAS.

This spectacular manuscript atlas is an outstanding cartographic work of the sixteenth century. Dated 1558 and signed by the Portuguese cartographer Diogo Homem (d. after 1576) and commissioned by Queen Mary of England probably as a gift for her husband, Philip II of Spain, the atlas comprises nine maps and diagrams.

Diogo Homem was a member of a well-known and admired family of cartographers. Born in Portugal, he left the country in 1545 accused of murder and lived for a time in England, before settling in Venice. This atlas is an outstanding example of his cartographic and artistic skills.

Dimensions: the parchment sheets of the atlas measure 58 x 80 cm.

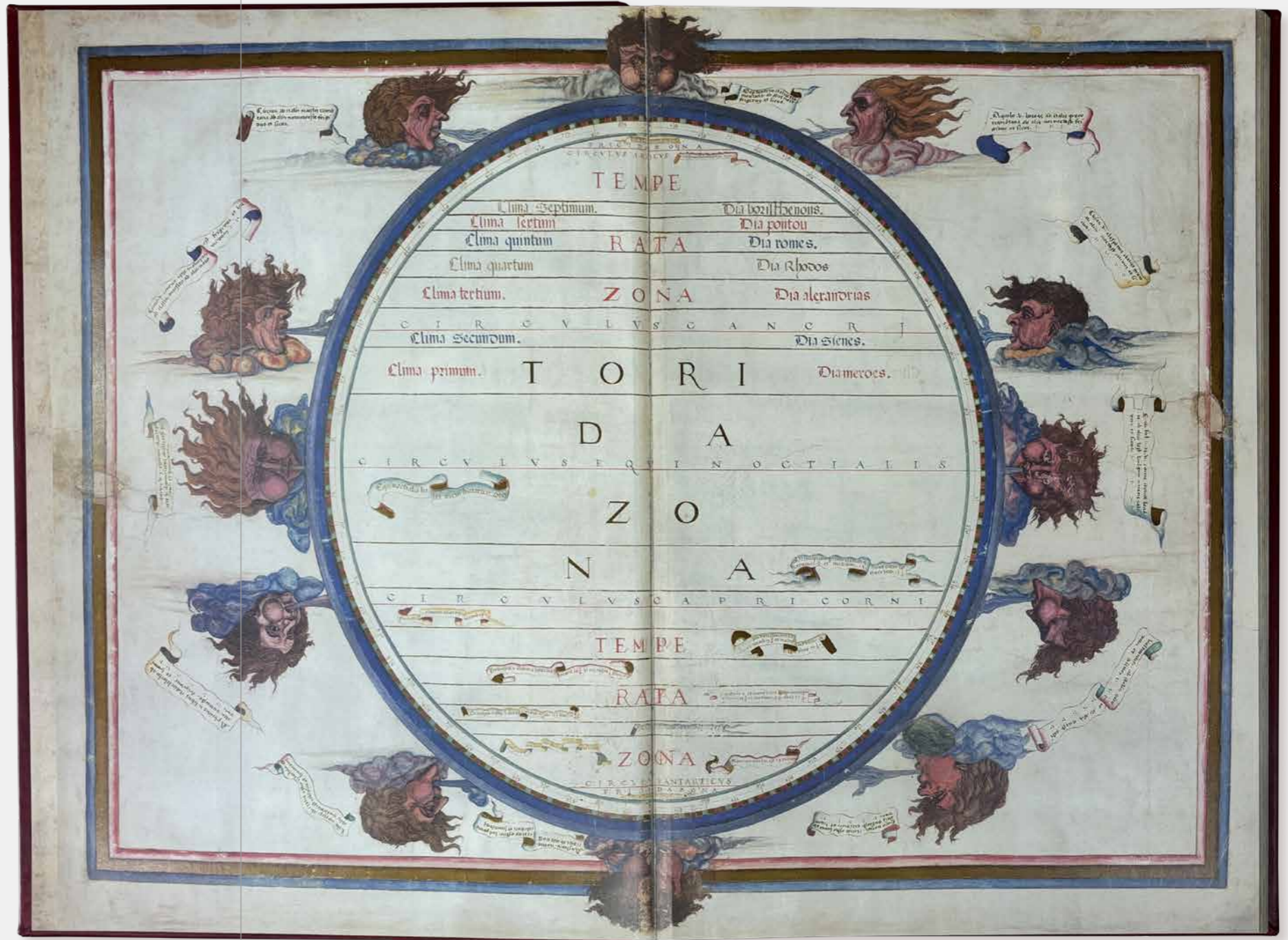
One of the most remarkable features of the atlas is its lavish decoration, with abundant flags, banners, coats of arms, and compass roses. Peoples, rulers, animals, and cities are illustrated, as are ships sailing the oceans and various sea creatures, following the fashions of the cartography of the time. It is probable that much of the embellishment was executed by Italian artists, either in England or in Italy, after Mary's death.

Following the tradition of nautical charts, most of the coastlines are accurately depicted, with abundant place names all along the coast, and networks of rhumb lines crossing the maps.

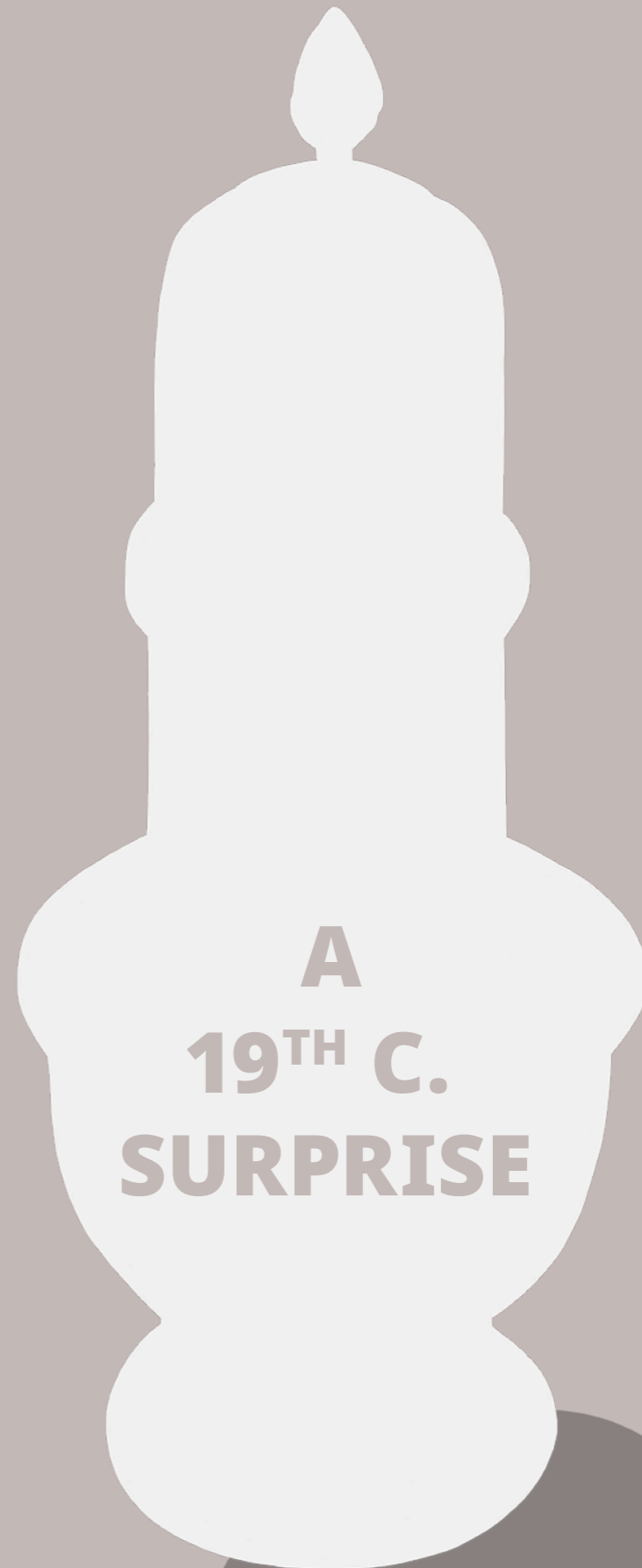
